From The Desk of Pastor Cranmer:

Dear wonderful congregation of St. Mark's,

I hope this message finds you well, and that you're excited to embark on the journey of Lent with me. As we prepare for this season, I wanted to take a moment to share some thoughts on how we can make the most of this time of contemplation and growth. The liturgical calendar is a lovely tool that helps us make sure we are taking time for all the emotions and experiences we feel in a lifetime, things like joy and anticipation at Christmas and Advent, but also the realities of life, existence, even sadness, loss, and self-consideration. The Lenten season and much of Holy Week is focused on these things, before Easter flips the switch back to another high point of celebration.



Lent is a time to intentionally focus on our relationship with God and our relationship with others. It's a time to look inward and identify areas in our lives where we need to grow and improve. We can think about it like spring cleaning to ready ourselves for the return of joy at Easter. It's also a time to look outward and to consider how we can be a blessing to those around us.

One way to do this is by engaging in acts of service and kindness. Whether it's volunteering at a local food bank, visiting someone who is sick, or simply taking the time to listen to a friend who is going through a tough time, there are countless ways to show love and kindness to others. By doing so, we not only bless those around us, but we also draw closer to God and become more like the person He has called us to be. We engage in the lifelong work of sanctification, where we grow our holiness over time and on purpose.

Another way to make the most of Lent is by practicing spiritual disciplines like prayer, (safe) fasting, and meditation. By setting aside time each day to connect with God, we create space for Him to speak to us and guide us on our journey. Whether it's through reading the Bible, spending time in silence, or engaging in other spiritual practices, there are many ways to deepen our relationship with God and grow in our faith. Many people choose to abstain from something at Lenten time. In recent years, people have taken up different interpretations of this like abstaining from overscheduling, complaining, or even social media.

Finally, I would encourage all of us to take time to reflect on the ways in which we can become more Christlike. None of us are perfect, and we all have areas in our lives where we need to grow and improve, myself included! But with God's help, we can become the people He has called us to be. I would invite you to try something new in your spiritual journey this Lent--a new devotional, a new small group (Wednesdays at 7 on Zoom is great if you haven't tried it), or a new spiritual practice. As Ash Wednesday reminds us, our time here is limited; we might as well explore the myriad of ways to connect with God while we can.

As we embark on this journey of Lent together, let's commit to supporting one another, praying for one another, and holding each other accountable as we seek to grow in our faith and in our love for others.

Indigenous Ministries and Tribal Relations
from the ELCA Ethnic Specific and Multicultural
Ministries

“The Lutheran witness of the gospel with American Indian and Alaska Native people has a history of more than 350 years. The Lutheran witness was seen among the Cherokee as they walked the infamous trail of tears and continues all the way to the Northern shores of Alaska’s Inupiat Eskimo people. The ELCA’s American Indian and Alaska Native membership is around 4,850. The American Indian and Alaska Native Ministries works closely with 30 native congregations around the country and is working to open new faith communities as well.

Relationships with American Indians and Alaska Natives in the ELCA are firmly grounded in reconciliation and the mutual building up of the saints — people of all backgrounds, tribes, regions, communities, congregations and unique needs. Together, we work with a common vision to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ, share in the ministry of word and sacrament, participate in God’s work of reconciliation in the world and creation, seek justice for all people and celebrate diversity within Christ’s unifying love. In our shared work, we strive to nurture and uphold the dignity of American Indian and Alaska Native people, their congregations and communities, and the church.”



We are blessed with opportunities to learn from other cultures, particularly the Native American. The Native Americans live in harmony with the human and the natural world. Their traditions and experiences teach us how to find strength, peace and emotional wellness.

I have been reading a wonderful book, *Ladder to the Light, An Indigenous Elder’s Meditations on Hope and*

Courage. The author, Steven Charleston, a Choctaw elder and Episcopal priest “offers words of hard-won hope, rooted in daily conversations with the Spirit and steeped in Indigenous wisdom.”

Following is an inspiring excerpt from *Ladder to the Light*.

Chapter 3 The Rung of Hope

...In 1831, the world came to an end for my family-and for all the families that were part of the Choctaw Nation. That year we were forced off our ancestral homeland and made to walk on a death march we called the Trail of Tears.

Thousands of our people died. We lost our homes, our way of life, even our graveyards. We lost everything.

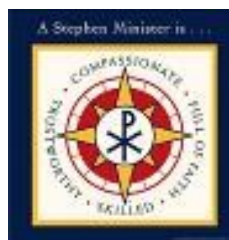
Everything, that is, except the one thing they could not take from us: hope. Hope kept us climbing toward the light, even though the world seemed to be filled with nothing but darkness.

Third on the ladder is the rung of hope, because hope is what emerges when you mix faith with blessing. I am not talking about wishful thinking. I am not talking about miracles. I am talking about hope as a tool to create light, a spark that can suddenly illuminate the gloom that creeps into our lives. The reason we have faith as the tinder and blessing as the spark is so we can have hope—the first flame of light in darkness.



Sanctuary

In these troubled times, I know a place where fear and uncertainty cannot come, where confidence and hope still shine brightly, where there is room for every person of every condition to gather in safety and strength. That place is in my heart. The princes of power who strut their moment upon the stage may rail against the others—the many others—they seek to shun from the embrace of freedom. But in my heart is sanctuary for each forgotten soul. No truth will be swept away, no justice lost, no mercy gone ungiven, for I keep them all here in my heart. There they secure until once more they are released to join what I know in your heart as well: an outpouring of love, a fulfillment of the prophecy you already read in these few simple words.

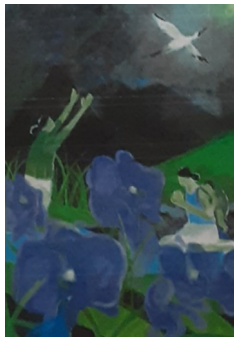

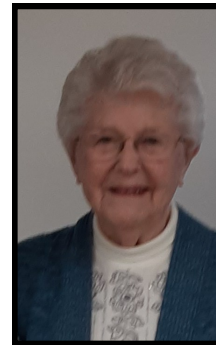

As a reminder, St. Mark's will be installing a smart lock (timed lock) on the East fellowship (basement) entry door most likely in 2023.

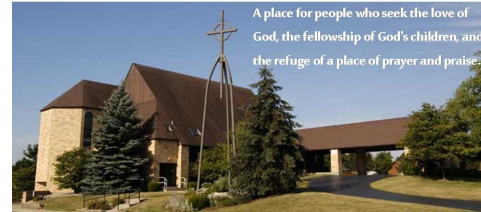
For safety reasons, the door will automatically lock at 10:15 am on Sunday's.

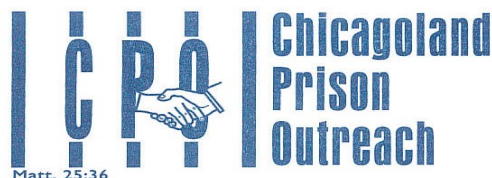
On behalf of the staff, directors on our board and the thousands of individuals who receive assistance every month at COOL, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for helping COOL Ministries during the calendar year ending December 2022. Your contributions truly make a difference and are appreciated.

With your help in 2022 we were able to provide food for 58,581 individuals and 17,724 families for a total of over 700,000 meals. The food pantry also collected and distributed boxes of toiletries and extras to an average of 85 veterans each month through our Veterans Program. Additionally, the COOL Family Housing Program provided shelter and services to 16 families (19 adults and 30 children) who had been homeless.

COOL Ministries has been blessed with generous and hardworking supporters for all our almost forty years as an organization. The invaluable work of our volunteers and support of our donors is crucial to the services we provide to the community, especially during times of such uncertainty. Many of our neighbors are facing increasing difficulties with making ends meet in today's inflated economy. With the cost of just about every commodity and service rising substantially those on a fixed income are affected the most and that is exactly who COOL serves; people on a fixed budget such as the elderly, the disabled, the homeless and anyone struggling to get by.

In the calendar year 2022, your contribution to COOL was **\$1,854.00** and **367** pounds of food and with it you have our heartfelt gratitude for your ongoing support of COOL Ministries through your contributions. Because of your support we can offer encouragement and hope to those who turn to us in their time of need.
